A Memorable, Magical Experience of Music and Community

On November 2 at Ithaca's State Theatre, close to 1,000 people came together and celebrated community and the milestone of 1,000 Vitamin L concerts. Vitamin L and special guests, The Dorothy Cotton Jubilee Singers, created a powerful sound and a stunning outpouring of positive energy that was appreciated by the enthusiastic crowd. The audience experienced "living history" when Civil Rights Leader Dorothy Cotton spoke on *The Importance of Music in Building Community* and sang a solo on the last song.

Prior to the concert exactly 1,000 3rd graders from all public and private schools in Tompkins County, Candor and South Seneca received a gift of the "Sing for Dr. King! Vitamin L Songs for a Beloved Community" CD and booklet. Their music teachers received the CD and songbook and were asked to teach all students the chorus of "Step Up, Speak Out!" and to teach 3rd graders "Walk a Mile" in advance of the concert. Third graders were invited onstage to join Vitamin L on that song, and some of them are pictured below.


THE GRATITUDE REPORT
